- 1 Consult the School of Undergraduate Studies for complete lists of courses that may be used fulfill the core curriculum requirements.
- 2 Courses used to fulfill flag requirements may fulfill other degree requirements as well; therefore, students should select courses carefully. If flag requirements are not satisfied within the minimum number of semester hours required for the degree and major, the student will need to complete additional coursework to fulfill these flag requirements.
- 3 Courses used to fulfill a writing flag requirement may also be used to fulfill other degree requirements, except RHE 306.
- 4 Courses used to fulfill entrance deficiencies do not count toward the degree; all entrance deficiencies must be removed by appropriate courses in order to graduate.
- 5 Chose from the following areas: anthropology, economics, geography, government, history, linguistics, psychology, and sociology. This requirement is in addition to the requirements for the core curriculum.
- 6 Chose from the following areas: architecture, classics (including classical civilization, Greek, Latin), comparative literature, humanities, philosophy, and interdisciplinary fields outside the Department of Art and Art History such as American studies, African and African American studies, Asian studies, Latin American studies, Mexican American studies, and Women's and Gender Studies. The student is encouraged to choose coursework of a multicultural nature. The following prefixes may count toward this requirement: AAS, AFR, AHC, AMS, ANS, ARC, C C, C L, CLS, CMS, EUS, GK, HMN, ISL, J S, LAS, LAT, MAS, MDV, MES, PHL, R S, REE, W S, WGS. Courses outside the Department of Art and Art History that are cross-listed with courses in the department may not be used to fulfill this requirement. This requirement is in addition to the requirements for the core curriculum.
- 7 Chose from the areas of study listed in the science and technology requirements of the core curriculum. Mathematics and computer sciences may also be counted toward this requirement. This requirement is in addition to the requirements for the core curriculum.
- 8 Three semester hours of art history used to fulfill major degree requirements may also be counted toward the visual and performing arts requirement of the core curriculum. Please consult the School of Undergraduate Studies for a complete list of courses that may be used for the visual and performing arts requirement.
- 9 Students who complete all stated degree requirements without earning the 120 semester hours required for the B.A. in Art: Studio Art Major must complete additional elective coursework until 120 hours are earned.

General Degree Requirements

Grade Point Average (GPA) Requirements: To graduate, students must have a GPA of at least 2.00 based on all courses undertaken at the university; a 2.50 GPA is required on all upper-division studio art courses taken in residence at the university.

Residency Requirements: Students must fulfill all residency requirements in order to graduate. Refer to chapter 1 in the *2010-2012 Undergraduate Catalog* for university residency requirements; refer to the College of Fine Arts' chapter for college residency requirements.

- Students must complete at least 60 semester hours of coursework counted toward the degree in residence.
- 24 of the last 30 semester hours counted toward the degree must be completed in residence.
- At least 6 semester hours of upper-division coursework in the major must be completed in residence.
- The last 18 hours of coursework in the major must be taken in residence.

Completing Degree Requirements: A minimum of 120 hours and all degree requirements stated in the *2010-2012 Undergraduate Catalog* must be completed in order to earn the degree.
